Before Reading Activities

- Look at the front/back cover and title. Predict what the story will be about based on what you already know.
- Do a letter walk through the book. Point out the letters you know.
- Grab a stuffed animal or pet to read to.
- Is this story real or make believe? How do I know.
- Why do I want to read this story?
- Who are the AUTHOR and ILLUSTRATOR?

While Reading Activities

- Look for your sight words and circle them with your finger
- Go outside and read your book.
- Make a video of yourself reading.
- Read aloud in a funny voice-or use a different voice for each character
- Grab a flashlight and read in the dark

After Reading Activities

- Discuss your favorite part of the story and act it out.
- Draw a picture of your favorite part of the story.
- Write a letter to a character in the story.
- Make a paper puppet of the main character(s). Use them when rereading the story.
- Is this story Real -Non-Fiction OR Made up in someone's head- FICTION? Discuss how you know.
- Can you think of anymore books written by this author?

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Before Reading Activities

- Look at the front/back cover and title. Predict what the story will be about based on what you already know.
- Ask yourself questions about the book and then try to answer them as you read.
- Is this story real (Non-Fiction) or make-believe (Fiction)? How do I know?
- Why do I want to read this story?

While Reading Activities

- Stop and do a comprehension check. Explain what you have read so far.
- Make a prediction about what you think will happen next.
- Substitute your name in place of the main character, where you appear as the main character.
- Read for 15 minutes in a comfy chair.

After Reading Activities

- Discuss your favorite part of the story and then act it out.
- Draw your favorite part of the story.
- Describe the main character and setting of the story.
- Write a letter to a character in the story.
- Talk about the main problem and the solution in the story.
- Draw a picture of the beginning, middle, and end of the story.
- Draw a comic strip using the main characters in a new adventure.

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Before Reading Activities

- Look at the front/back cover and title. Predict what the story will be about based on what you already know.
- Discuss the GENRE of the book. How can you tell?
- Is this Non-Fiction or Fiction? How do I know.
- Why do I want to read this story?
- Has the author written any other books? Have you read any other books by this author?

While Reading Activities

- Stop and do a comprehension check. Explain what you have read so far.
- Make a prediction about what happens next.
- Use post-it notes to mark pages with questions you have or quotes to share
- Write down and look up unknown words

After Reading Activities

- Draw or act out your favorite part of the story.
- Write a letter from one character in the book to another discussing a scene from the story.
- Talk about the main problem and solution in the story.
- Create a collage around the characters or themes in the book.
- Write a book review/recommendation to get your friends to read the story.
- Research the time period, famous person, or historical event mentioned in the book.
